- 1) High resolution, print-ready photograph or illustration
- 2) 100 word, non-technical statement that articulates the broader relevance of the science represented by the image
- 3) Names and institutional affiliations of all co-entrants
- 4) Current or former NIH funding source (e.g., grant number)
