MARC TRAVEL AWARDS ANNOUNCED FOR THE EXPERIMENTAL BIOLOGY 2006 MEETING

Bethesda, MD – The Federation of American Societies for Experimental Biology (FASEB) Minority Access to Research Careers (MARC) Program is pleased to announce the travel award recipients for the Experimental Biology 2006 meeting to be held in San Francisco, California, on April 1-5, 2006. The awards are provided to encourage participation in the meeting by underrepresented minority students, postdoctorates, and their faculty mentors. This year, MARC conferred 129 awards totaling more than \$187,000. All travel awards are funded through a grant from the National Institute of General Medical Sciences, National Institutes of Health. A key goal of the FASEB MARC Program is to increase the number and competitiveness of underrepresented minorities engaged in biomedical research.
