- \$19.3M** NIH funding for workforce training and development grants in Ohio, which help prepare the scientific leaders of the future
- \$17.2M** NIH funding to 26 Ohio businesses for research and development of technology offering potential commercial applications
- 48.1K** Bioscience research industry jobs in Ohio, which offer an average annual wage \$30.6K higher than the total private sector (2016 TEconomy Report)
- 2,696** Bioscience research industry business establishments in Ohio operating in 2014 (2016 TEconomy Report)
