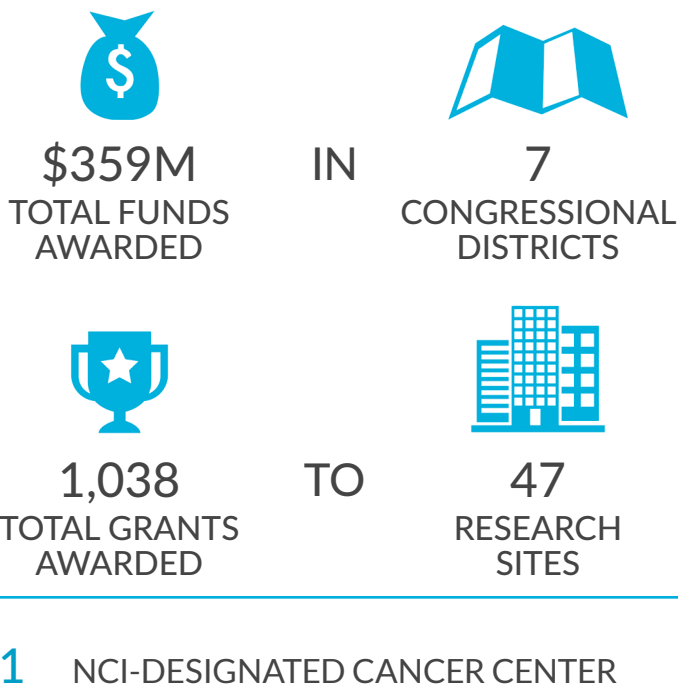


2017 Federal Research Funding
